



Tasmanian Public Land Deer Hunting Project

The TDAC, ADA & SSAA have been working with NRE over the last period towards opening Public Lands controlled by NRE and or PARKS, Parks are currently undertaking site inspected and audits to ensure they are suitable to be released for deer hunting and if any times of the year restriction may apply.

At this stage we are looking at including these new areas into the current Hunting Ballot Program run by NRE for the Stag Season and then open for general antlerless deer hunting after the Stag Season, this is still TBC as the lower graded areas may just be opened for Deer Hunting for the Seasons, all is on the table currently until we get a feel on interest from hunters and the quality of hunting on each block.

We are also asking members that are willing to assist in an assessment program to assess sites for suitability for deer hunting to contact us and we can supply more information and resources to help us grade these areas with suitability for hunting and level of deer numbers.

- o Antlers must be displayed at the Northern Branch April Meeting
- o Prize is awarded at the General meeting on 12th June
- **2026 Photographic Awards** awarded to the best photos in the following categories:

General Hunting Interest Secured Trophy Trail Camera Live Game

• FCA Competition – present a photo of a feral cat taken humanely to be eligible for this award.

Bush Fire Awareness

The Tasmanian Fire Service have no current restrictions in place at the moment. We recommend that all members keep on top of the current restrictions as different property owners have different rules around access during fire permit periods. The Tasmanian Fire Service regularly review the permit requirements and the requirement for a total fire ban. National AGM

Scott, Phil & Lyndal attended the National AGM.

The current branch accounts at Westpac earn no interest. We can put money into a National Term Deposit to earn additional interest. Scott to discuss with Sean for the North West monies to be put into the term deposit, with Northern Branch topping up to \$10,000.

Policys approved – Textbook and equipment scholarship, Political donations.

AGM timing was late as they were waiting on the audit.

Discussion was also held on the amount of information the branch receives on new members. Phil to talk to Sean about what is sent by National to new members so we are aware.

Want to get a group chat together of the branch presidents which is being worked on.

They want to get the National conference up and running again.

National membership is up to around 7,000 members.

Advocacy update:

Scott & Andrew met with Gavin Pearce the new minister for deer.

Discussions were held in relation to the deer survey results but assured there would be no knee jerk reactions.

Deer are still partially protected and will remain that way.

Need to narrow down the number of permits and the purpose of these.

Opening up public land for hunting, may not be the best ground for deer hunting, but is a good starting point. Will likely be bundled in with the other balloted public land for the buck season, and a booking system for the anterless season.

30% increase in deer numbers 5 years 6% year on year which is in line with what the Government had anticipated and was sold as a good news story. The message is to reduce numbers and control the population we need to shoot more does, giving out more stag tags won't help with population control.

Need to look at how we incentivise this, one option could be meat only hunter gets a cheaper licence. There is a crop protection licence for possums, wallaby's and anterless deer that is tied to the landowner, this has been available since 2024.

Public land hunting – draft block assessment sheet

This form has been developed for members to go for a bushwalk and have a look at the areas (without their rifles) fill in the forms and sending back to the secretary for compilation. This will enable a rating system to be developed for the land that becomes available. There are a number of new blocks they are hoping to be opened but may not be in time for the next buck season.

Landowner hunter matching service

There is funding available for this, it has fallen over with Tasfarmers. SSAA are advocating to use their farmassist program to assist with this. NRE may look at putting someone on to manage this role.

This is aimed at assisting property owners with their pest reduction when required.

New Game animal permits

There are currently 12 different permit types, need to reduce the number of permits and the red tape.

Illegal sale of Tasmanian Venison products

There has been some recent facebook posts about sale of venison for human and pet consumption. This has been reported to NRE who are looking into it. The Human consumption trial was only supposed to be for high end restaurants.

ATV Use Forico

UTV/side by side can be used on Forico, but they have to be registered and insured. ATV and four wheel motorbikes cannot be used.

The UTVs need to go through the same process as motor vehicles for BHG members and must stay on formed tracks and have the same rules as motor vehicles. Leigh to send out email to BHG members.

Hunters Booking Camelford

From 11 July when the email was sent to the BHG members, Forico has been hunted 190 hours 58% of this was on Camelford, 66% of the bookings (134 bookings) were on Camelford. There are 4 blocks currently closed for hunting due to forestry operations, which will inflate these figures.

The hunt coordinators need to work with the members that are interested to take these members around the other blocks so they know where the entries, boundarys etc are to these blocks. Continue to encourage hunters to go onto other blocks, still give them access to Camelford for deer.
